



The internship culminates with a deliverable such as a written report, a policy brief, a presentation to stakeholders, or a clinically tailored infographic or executive summary - products intended to inform advocacy strategies, policy changes, or healthcare practice improvements.

- Activities
- Learn about the principles of medical-legal partnership (MLP) and its role in addressing health-harming civil legal needs.
  - Review documents and interview key informants to understand barriers, gaps, or inequities affecting patients at participating healthcare institutions.
  - Interview MLP attorneys and clinical stakeholders (physicians, program coordinators, social workers) to document the ways in which patients, communities, or healthcare systems are impacted by the selected legal-health issue.
  - Examine any specific benefits, rights, or protections in law or policy that pertain to the identified focus area.
  - Collaborate with legal colleagues to determine strategies for advocacy, accountability, and systemic improvement.
  - From the health professional perspective, assist legal colleagues in understanding the clinical implications and health system costs of barriers related to the selected topic.
